The Third Conditional

if + past perfect, + would have + past participle would have + past participle + if + past perfect

We use the *third conditional* when talking about **events that have already happened.** This is used when it is impossible for the condition to be fulfilled as the time for it to happen has already passed.

- If I had started earlier, I would have finished the work by now. Or:
- I would have finished the work by now if I had started earlier.
